Agriculture & Rural Life Issues

WLBG broadcast a syndicated program, “Loos Tales” with Trent Loos, who travels around the country talking with people involved in Agribusiness and the rural lifestyle. The program deals with a wide variety of agri-business issues, and is broadcast Monday thru Friday at 7:50.

WLBG featured an interview with Anne Brock at Clemson University Extension Office about a 4-H River Adventure Camp. The interview discussed the camp’s goal of providing a fun three day workshop along the banks of the Enoree River to connect kids with the outdoors while also educating them on water quality issues impacting the river and its surrounding areas. Kids would also have the chance to learn about the history of the area, perform water chemistry experiments, go bug hunting, and take part in wildlife studies. This interview aired during the Morning News Magazine at approximately 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21.

Animal Issues

On Wednesday, June 27th, 2007 Elaine Hunter from the SC Humane Society (SCHSPCA) was a featured guest on the Morning News Magazine on WLBG. She promoted the fundraiser yard sale to be held that upcoming Saturday, telling how proceeds would enable the Humane Society to do more for Laurens County animals. This interview was aired 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21 am, and again during the 5pm hour on In the Zone for Sports that afternoon.

Community & Cultural Events

WLBG promoted attendance at a Laurens County welcome ceremony for new PC Head Football Coach Bobby Bentley for Tuesday afternoon at the Laurens County Higher Education Center. Our promotion included interviews with sponsoring Chamber CEO Rob Clapper on the Morning News Magazine from 6-8:30, and on Good Morning Up-Country around 9am, plus a promo with Rob Clapper’s voice, during the day prior to the event. We also broadcast “In the Zone” from the Higher Education Center that afternoon from 4-6pm.

WLBG promoted “Kaleidoscope of the Arts”, held Saturday 4/21/07 from 10-3 on the Laurens Public Square. The interactive art festival was held in conjunction between School District 55 and Main Street Laurens. WLBG made public service announcements on Community Calendar 4/18 and 4/20, and interviewed Main Street Director Jonathan Irick on the Morning News Magazine Friday, 4/19/07 at 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21.

Real Radio 860 had Leon Greene, a member of the 1983 and 1984 state championship football teams at Laurens District High School on with a recorded interview on In The Zone for Sports on Monday, May 21, 2007 at 5:20pm as well as the 6, 7, and 8am hours of The UpCountry's morni9ng news magazine of Wednesday May 23, 2007 to promote the upcoming reunion on June 2, 2007 at LDHS for these championship teams.

Real Radio 860 had David Corley, a faculty member of Laurens District High School appear on In The zone for Sports at 5:20pm on Thursday, May 17, 2007 and again Tuesday, May 22, 2007 during the 6, 7, and 8am hours of The UpCountry's morning news magazine to promote the upcoming graduation ceremonies at the high school. He also discussed the addition of the live closed-circuit feed for the overflow crowd in the school's lecture theatre. This was a new addition and the school wanted to promote this on-air.

She not only talked about the event and how people come out to see the play and support the theater, but she talked about the theater's importance in the community and encouraged our listeners to get involved. Economic Development

WLBG News reported Tuesday 4/3 on Clinton City Council's 1st reading approval the previous night of new Hospitality and Accommodation taxes. We followed up on Wednesday morning's Morning News Magazine (4/4/07), interviewing Interim City Manager Josh Kay about the goals of the new taxes, which include development of a Recreation Park for the City. The interview aired at 6:08, 7:20 & 8:20.

WLBG's Morning News Magazine Thursday 4/5/07 talked with Diane Wyatt, Director of the Downtown Clinton Association, about that group's plans for the upcoming summer season. She talked about the Town Rythms program bringing the Tams and Drifers to Clinton this summer. We also talked about an upcoming Yard Sale downtown Clinton, and about the Clinton Downtown Association's upcoming annual meeting.

WLBG's Morning News Magazine talked with Jim Potts, President of the Laurens County Forest Landowners Association, on Friday, April 13th – about the upcoming Tuesday 4/17 meeting of the group. He told how the association helps with ideas on growing timber, and managing wildlife on Laurens County land.

WLBG promoted the Downtown Clinton Sidewalk & Yard Sale promotion with announcements the week prior to the event on Saturday, May 5th. On Wednesday, May 2nd, we broadcast an interview with Downtown Director Diane Wyatt on the Morning News Magazine at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21.

When a petition drive surfaced, in an attempt to disband the taxing district that supports Main Street Laurens, WLBG announcers commented on the need to maintain the district to continue promoting the development and growth of the downtown business district. In an effort to provide both sides of the issue, the WLBG Morning News Magazine had Sara Lanahan, who was promoting the petition, on our program Friday, May 4, to present her side of the issue. We broadcast the 5-minute interview at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21 am.

WLBG interviewed Laurens Main Street Director Jonathan Irick on Good Morning UpCountry Monday, 5/7/07, about the program and the current campaign to have a petition signed to disband the tax district that helps fund the program.

When a former Mayor who is supporting the petition challenged some of the information presented by Mr. Irick, WLBG followed up and made a clarification the following morning on Good Morning UpCountry.

Ronnie Campbell, owner of the Historic Capital Theatre on the historic Laurens Square, re-opened the venue for first-run movies on Friday, May 25th, 2007. This was the first time a movie had shown in the theatre in over 40 years, and the first movie in Laurens County in some ten years. WLBG interviewed Mr. Campbell about the new development on the Morning News Magazine Friday morning, 5/25, at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21. The interview was repeated "In the Zone" at 5:15pm. Campbell was also on Good Morning UpCountry Friday morning from 8:40-9am.

Education

WLBG conducted interviews on plans for a Charter School for Thornwell, after the Charter School committee and District 56 began a program of working together on a revised plan. We interviewed District 56 Superintendent Dr. Wayne Brazell on Monday, May 14th at 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21, and we interviewed Charter School Project Director Norman Dover at the same times on Friday, 5/18/07.

Laurens County Literacy presented a Basic Computer Class Monday through Thursday mornings, June 25th thru 28th. WLBG interviewed Theresa Brewton of the Literacy Council about the course in an interview broadcast at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21 am Tuesday, June 5th, 2007. We also announced the class on the Community Calendar, including on Saturday, June 2nd.

WLBG featured E.B. Morse Elementary principal Diane Simmons on the Morning News Magazine in an interview that aired Wednesday, June 6th at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21 am. The interview focused on the school's new 4K Extension Program that would allow any student in the district just completing 4K to continue to review educational basics throughout the summer. The program aims to give those children a more solid base at the beginning of their educational career. The program was also announced on the Community Calendar several times.

The Laurens County Book Mobile makes various stops around the county, taking books to the children. It also encourages students to take advantage of programs at the local libraries. The Bookmobile schedule is announced on the Community Calendar weekly.

John Avery hosted an interview with Pam Bennett of the Laurens County library on his afternoon sports talk show In the Zone for Sports. Bennett told John about various summer programs being offered at the library including a visit and reading session with Ronald McDonald. They also talked about the used book sale that helps raise funds for the library. This interview was aired again during

the Morning News Magazine on Tuesday, June 26, 2007 at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21 am.

Emergency Issues

WLBG's news department got an alert on the air ASAP following a report from the Clinton Public Safety Department about an armed and dangerous suspect on the loose after a weekend murder. The event took place on the night of Sunday, June 24th, 2007 and WLBG aired the news story throughout the day June 25th and June 26th until the suspect was apprehended.

Environmental Issues

Gray Court residents Jeff Nichols and Diane Culbertson organized a citizens campaign to address environmental concerns about a new landfill proposed for the Martin's Lake area. WLBG covered their efforts with an interview on the Morning News Magazine at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21; then additional conversation on Good Morning UpCountry between 8:40 and 9am – the day of their meeting with D-HEC officials, on Tuesday, May 29th, 2007. We also announced the meeting on the Community Calendar for a few days prior, up to the meeting date.

Governmental Issues

WLBG news reported on the search for a new City Manager for the City of Clinton during April. We also broadcast interviews with the top two candidates for the post on the Morning News Magazine Tuesday, April 17th and Thursday, April 19th.

WLBG news reported on the City of Clinton's first Budget Work Session for the upcoming year's budget, held Monday, 4/30/07. On our news reports Wednesday, 5/2/07, we outlined the overall figures from the General Fund and Utility Fund, and how expenses and income is categorized.

WLBG's Morning News Magazine interviewed Laurens County Council Chairman Jim Coleman Monday Morning, 5/7/07, about the past week's first budget work session. Coleman outlined the difficulties the county faces with continued depreciation in the amount of revenue generated by a mill, and outlined options under consideration.

WLBG talked with Clinton Mayor Randy Randall about the selection of a new City Manager on Tuesday, May 7th, 2007.

WLBG interviewed County Council Chairman Jim Coleman following a budget workshop Tuesday, 5/8/07, and discussed plans Council made, prioritizing

\$981,000 in capital expenses for the upcoming fiscal year. We reviewed some of the items on the 14 point list, and discussed decisions made by council to use 29% of the local option sales tax, along with a 2 mill increase for capital improvements in the upcoming year, to fund the capital needs.

As part of WLBG news coverage of a Clinton City Council meeting the previous evening, WLBG News Tuesday, 5/8/07 reported on the selection of a new City manger for the City of Clinton, and we reported on Council giving final approval to new Hospitality and Accommodation taxes to help fund recreational opportunities and related economic development in the City of Clinton.

WLBG discussed current developments in the state legislature with Representative Adam Taylor

State Representative Adam Taylor was featured during the morning news in news stories that ran at the top and bottom of every hour from 6AM to 8:30AM on Friday 6/1/07, and periodically throughout the day. The news story discussed the progress being made on the state budget and a proposed cigarette tax increase.

WLBG's morning talk show, Good Morning UpCountry, featured State Representative Jeff Duncan as a guest. Duncan discussed political issues including a controversial bill he sponsored that would permit concealed weapons on school campuses. Other topics of discussion were the cigarette tax and other budget issues. This occurred Friday 6/1/07 between 8:50AM and 10AM.

WLBG's Morning News Magazine featured an interview with State Senator Danny Verdin to talk about the status of the state budget. Verdin discussed the compromises made on worker's comp and DOT reform as well as the numerous tax breaks that taxpayers would receive through income tax reduction and an elimination of the grocery tax. Verdin also gave an update on the status of the cigarette tax and weighed in on his feelings of the budget overall. The interview aired at 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21am.

Health

WLBG News on Friday, 4/27/07 reported on the April Laurens County Health Care Board meeting for April, held earlier in the week. We noted progress made on a planned expansion for a Colonoscopy Center, additional treatment rooms, and offices for new doctors being recruited in new specialties for Laurens County.

The need to address providing health care to working residents of Laurens County who cannot afford Health Insurance was discussed with Laurens County Health Care System CEO Rich D'Alberto on WLBG. He was a guest between 8:40 and 9 am on Good Morning UpCountry Thursday, 4/26/07, and again on the Morning News Magazine Friday morning, 4/27/07 at 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21.

WLBG reported on Laurens County receiving an honor as the Most Improved County in South Carolina for Public Health, as acknowledged by the Governor & Mrs. Sanford's Healthy SC Campaign. We initially announced this on WLBG News Thursday, May 17th, and we updated this during the trip to Columbia the following Thursday, and on subsequent news reports.

On Friday 6/1/07, Real Radio 860 featured an interview with Laurens Family YMCA trainer Graham Whitlock. The interview discussed a new "Fit Kids" program and gym at the YMCA as well as a Wellness Works program that offers free assistance in the weight room and in developing a work out program for individuals to promote better health and fitness. It aired at 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21 as well as during our afternoon show In the Zone during the 5pm hour.

On Friday 6/8/07, Real Radio 860 had Harlan Thompson, Amelia Childress, and Marion Reeder as featured guests on the Morning News Magazine. In a 5 minute interview, the three gave information on this year's Relay for Life to be held that Friday night into Saturday morning of 6/9/07.. Relay for Life is an annual program to raise awareness and benefit the American Cancer Society. The interview aired at 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21 and again during the afternoon broadcast of In the Zone for Sports during the 5pm hour.

Patty Kirk was a featured guest on In the Zone for Sports during the 5pm hour on Friday 6/8/07. She spoke about the 1st Annual Poker Run to End Sexual Violence that was scheduled for the next day. This poker run raised funds for the Sexual Trauma and Counseling Center as well as Childs Place, another sexual violence help center. The interview discussed the event as well as the purpose behind it.

Judicial reform

WLBG News on Wednesday, 5/9/07, reported on discussions the previous night between 8th Circuit Solicitor Jerry peace and Laurens County Council regarding the issue of overcrowding in the county detention center, and the overall issues about a judicial system overburdened with cases to be handled in Laurens County.

WLBG talked with Representatives Mike Pitts and Jeff Duncan on Good Morning UpCountry, May 14th and June 1st, 2007. Among items discussed was the procedure for electing Judges to the State Supreme Court, in view of a current election.

Military & Veterans Issues

Laurens County Veterans' plans to bring the Traveling Wall to Laurens County in September, 2007 were highlighted on WLBG Tuesday, April 10th. The Morning News Magazine talked with Laurens County Veterans Affairs Director Carey Bolt

about plans to have the half-scale replica of the Vietnam Memorial in Washington DC on display in Laurens County. We also talked of how listeners can help with funds to pay for the expense of bringing the wall to Laurens County.

When 90 National Guard members from Laurens and nearby counties were being deployed to the Mexican Boarder April 20th, and WLBG was informed that they were not being equipped with insect repellent and sun screen, we conducted an on-air campaign Thursday and Friday, April 19th and 20th, and delivered sun screen and insect repellent to the troops. This was a joint effort of WLBG with the Family Readiness Support Group and the Laurens County Veterans Affairs Office.

WLBG's Morning News Magazine featured an interview with Charles Johnson of Baldwin Pontiac-Buick-GMC about a nationwide "Million Thanks" campaign the local dealership is participating in, to show support to our troops overseas. During the interview, at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21 Wednesday, 5/9/07, Johnson told of have materials in the lobby of the dealership for people to come by and send letters of support to the troops, and of having children in some local schools joining the effort thru their classroom.

On Memorial Day – May 28th – WLBG's Good Morning UpCountry had Col. Barrett Holmes of the US Army as our guest. We discussed his impressions of US efforts in Iraq, based on his experiences during a tour of duty in Iraq in 2004-2005, and his contacts with friends who are there now.

Minority Concerns

WLBG interviewed Laurens City Councilman Frank Richardson and Michael Washington, HR Manger for Wal-Mart, discuss Juneteenth Celebration coming up Friday and Saturday, June 15 & 16. The City & Wal-Mart sponsor the 2nd annual celebration and discussed it's purposes to celebrate unity in the community in interviews on the WLBG Morning News magazine Thursday, 6/7 and Thursday, 6/14, at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21am. They also appeared on WLBG's Saturday Morning Gospel June 9th.

Public Safety

WLBG featured an interview with Kim Perry, a therapist from the Laurens County Safe Home, on Tuesday, June 20, 2007. The interview was to inform listeners of the new support group being started up for women who are or have been in abusive relationships. She also told listeners how they could help those in need through donations, volunteering, and other things. This interview aired at 6:07, 7:21 & 8:21am.

Recreation

WLBG broadcast Dixie Youth Baseball games from Laurens 2-4 evenings a week, and did a live broadcast Saturday 5/12/07 from 12-2pm from the annual Hot Dog Day at Collier Park.

WLBG's In the Zone for Sports had an interview with local youth Kyle Blocker after he was named as a Dixie Youth Future Start to participate in the All Star Tournament. The interview aired at 5:20 pm on Tuesday 5/29/07.

WLBG's John Avery interviewed the new head football coach at Presbyterian College, Bobby Bentley, on In the Zone for Sports around 4:30pm on Tuesday, June 5, 2007. The interview was to inform the community of the football camp that Bentley would be hosting to gear up current football players in college, high school, and middle school ranks, as well as a way to teach the basics to others interested in playing football.

WLBG had Donna Arnold of the Laurens Family YMCA on the Morning News Magazine on Monday, June 11, 2007. In the interview that aired at 6:07, 7:21, 8:21 am Arnold spoke about the various summer sports camps offered by the organization. In April, A Chestnut Ridge Church of Laurens announced plans to send sending another team to Africa in early November. We talked with Team leader James Hill on the Morning News magazine Friday, 5/4/07 at 6:07, 7:21, 8:21 am. We discussed an upcoming fund-raising event for the mission trip set for the Church on May 12th.

WLBG interviewed David & Judy Humphries on Monday, April 30th about their upcoming departure in early summer for a two year assignment in Africa. We talked about their work plans for their time there, which will include assisting teams coming to work, such as the one from their own church in November. The interview aired at 6:08, 7:21 & 8:21.
